In particular, it presents the history and development of lexicography, the typology of dictionaries and their structure. Examples of the topics discussed are: Non-Alphabetical Dictionaries, Bilingual Dictionaries, Language Databases in Lexicography, Equivalence in Dictionaries, Phonetic Transcriptions, Methods of Data Collection.
