Subject objectives	The aim of the course is to introduce students to the fundamentals of research methodologies in drama studies through the analysis of selected examples from dramatic literature and theoretical texts. The course encourages students to approach the dramatic text as a form of discourse that lends itself to critical analysis and serves as a basis for formulating coherent interpretations. In addition, the course is designed to enable students to acquire and apply appropriate terminology used in drama studies. The teacher collaborates with MA seminar supervisors to support the thesis-writing process through the careful selection of topics and sources.
