The thematic scope includes both large companies and entities from the small and medium-sized enterprise (SME) sector. Students participating in the seminar will have the opportunity to write bachelors theses on issues such as financial analysis, assessment of business performance, the use of controlling tools, and ESG reporting. The seminar allows for the development of both analytical and research-oriented theses such as financial data analysis, international comparisons, or evaluations of the effectiveness of financial management strategies in various types of organizations. Particular emphasis is placed on the practical aspects of enterprise operations in a changing economic environment.</p>
