Subject contents	<p><b>The integrated course component</b></p> <p>Continuation of work on the development of lexical and grammatical resources, with particular emphasis on enriching the database of idioms, proverbs and collocations at the C2 level using, among others, multiple choice lexical cloze text and key word transformations. Further work on developing listening comprehension skills at C2 level using authentic audio/video materials; in particular, understanding the opinions of the speaker/speakers, which are the starting point for expressing and defending one's own opinion and discussion on a given topic. Improving the understanding of authentic written text at the C2 level, in particular understanding its functions and skillfully summarizing and paraphrasing the text, taking into account the implied meanings. Particular emphasis on vocabulary and its use when discussing related topics. Further development of speaking skills through tasks enabling active exchange of ideas in pairs, groups and in the forum of the entire group. Work on improving 'public' speaking skills by preparing short speeches presenting the conclusions/opinions of all group members. Continued monitoring of pronunciation, mainly at the suprasegmental level.</p> <p><b>The spoken rhetoric component</b></p> <p>The topic is devoted to developing selected communicative competences through discussions and dialogues, formal speeches and participation in public debates (demonstrative and expository speeches as the basic forms of oral expression). These exercises are based on a specific vocabulary learned during classes on a given topic, e.g. everyday life, culture, social issues.</p>									
Prerequisites and co-requisites	<p>Obtaining a positive grade in the Practical English Language Test (PNJA) after semester 2.</p> <p>The condition for passing the third semester is to obtain a positive grade in each PNJA component. A negative grade for even one of them results in an unsatisfactory grade for the entire module.</p>
