<b>Subject objectives</b>	<p>The course introduces students to theatre pedagogy and offers the opportunity to apply this method in team management. It supports the creation of inclusive environments that recognise and harness people's creative potential.</p> <p>Theatre pedagogy is an independent discipline that combines theatre and education. It emphasises respect for diverse perspectives and experiences, fosters spaces for the exchange of differing viewpoints, invites creative dialogue, and balances the artistic process with group dynamics. It does not teach a specific method, theory, or theatrical practice; rather, it draws on these elements to cultivate self-reflection, improve communication, and deepen social awareness. In this way, it enhances both creative and receptive competencies, while also contributing to the development of intrapersonal and interpersonal skills. The primary mode of working in theatre pedagogy is the theatre-pedagogical workshop, which uses theatre as a tool for reflecting on selected issues and this is how students will engage during the course.</p>
