Subject contents	The course introduces students to the issues of image anthropology and art anthropology, in which images and art are treated as cultural categories. Classic concepts concerning symbolism and visual forms in various cultures are discussed, including Inuit ornamentation, the concept of the totem, and Aboriginal art. Issues such as the origins and beginnings of art, ethnoaesthetics, iconophilia and iconoclasm, icon semiotics, miraculous imagination, and artistic consciousness are analyzed.
