Subject contents	Introducing students to the research conditions and methods used by researchers dealing with various fields of art history and different periods in its history. The classes show how research into a work of art, its creator and its audience can be approached in a multifaceted way. They point out the limitations and obstacles that researchers encounter in their practice. They present theoretical assumptions for research, as well as practical solutions or proposals for solving specific research problems. The classes discuss, among other things, such issues as the ability to obtain information on a given subject, familiarity, the cooperation of an art historian with representatives of other scientific disciplines (issues of identifying the matter of a work of art, its age, reaching layers invisible to the naked eye), the importance of archival materials in the analysis and interpretation of a work of art, reconstruction of the artist's oeuvre and his artistic path, possibilities and limitations of stylistic analysis.
