Subject contents	The history of modern universal and Polish art. The program content includes issues that enable the student to learn and understand selected artistic issues. The knowledge is transmitted problematically. Art in Poland will each time be considered as part of the European heritage, and complemented by the analysis of specific manifestations of Old Polish artistic culture. The main emphasis will be placed on the formation of the ability to formulate statements and hypotheses taken up in the literature of the subject based on the exercise of the ability to independently search for sources, literature on the subject and its critical reading.
