The course focuses on presenting the specific features of technical language, basic terminology and the most significant issues associated with the translation of specialist texts. The aim is also to enable students to acquire the skills to translate simpler technical texts in the Polish–German language pair, using basic translation tools.

Subject contents	As part of the course, students will familiarise themselves with basic terminology from selected fields of technology, such as e.g. information technology, engineering, industry, transport, construction, the automotive sector, energy, the operation of domestic appliances, and health and safety at work. The course covers the basic types of technical texts and their specific lexical and grammatical features. Students analyse simple specialist texts and translate them in the Polish–German language pair. The course also includes group discussions of translations and fundamental differences in terminology and translation practice.
