Subject contents	Speech sound as an acoustic and articulatory phenomenon. Physiology of speech. Speech transcription. Speech vs. writing. Discrepancy between speech and writing in the Polish language. Phonetic alphabet, phonetic transcription. Articulatory characteristics of Polish sounds, elements of auditory and acoustic classification. Constraints of coarticulation and positional occurrence of sounds. Phonetic realization of inter-word connections. Principles of correct Polish pronunciation, selected phonetic errors. Changes in the phonemic state of words: assimilation, dissimilation, reduction, epenthesis, metathesis. Types of assimilation in Polish. Regional pronunciation. Prosodic features: stress, intonation, quantity. Characterization of accent in the Polish language. Complex phonetic units: syllable, phonetic word, intonational phrase. Phoneme vs. speech sound. Phonemes and their variants; types of phonemic variants. Distinctive features in the Polish language. Phonological system of contemporary Polish compared to the minimal system. Basic differences between selected phonological systems (e.g., Stieber's, Jassem's, Laskowski's) and sources of divergence between them. Basics of phonological transcription
