Subject contents	The origin of the Polish language (the place of Polish in the family of Indo-European languages, Polish among the Slavic languages). Research methods of diachronic linguistics. Evolution of language and its subsystems. The main transformations of the phonological system: vocalization - qualitative changes (metathesis and overtone) and quantitative changes (concerning iteration, vocalization or the disappearance of iterations and the development of sonants) ; consonantism: palatalizations, dyspalatalizations and the emergence of new phonemes; changes in consonant groups.
