Subject contents	Terms: dialectology, dialect, traditional dialect, idiom, and ethnolect, traditional dialectology; dialectisms and regionalisms; the role of traditional dialects and vernaculars in contemporary culture; the history of Polish dialectology and dialectological research methods (linguistic geography); introduction to dialectal phonetic features (variations in Polish inter-word phonetics, realization of the vowels i/y, contemporary articulation of so-called close vowels, reduction of unstressed vowels, pronunciation of nasal vowels, initial prostheses, the essence of mazurzenie, mixing of phonetic series and kaszubienie, variations in the articulation of soft labial consonants, soft velar consonants and their contemporary realization), morphological features (e.g., selected dialectal derivational and inflectional suffixes of nouns, adjectives, and verbs), and syntactic features; characteristics of the main Polish dialects: Mazovian, Greater Polish, Lesser Polish, and Silesian; the linguistic status of Kashubian; traditional dialectal lexicon; traditional dialectal stylization and new contexts of occurrence in culture (advertisements, films, theatrical works, cabarets, the internet, etc.), the language of folklore, the artistic style of traditional dialect; dialectal onomastics; Polish traditional dialects abroad; parallel description of traditional dialects and culture.
