Subject contents	State constitution (structure of the constitution; most important provisions of the constitution of the Russian Federation). Federal structure of the state: federal structure of the state (republics, countries, oblasts, cities of federal importance, autonomous oblast, autonomous districts); the role of federation entities. Presidential power in Russia: political position of the president; structure and organization of the presidential office; presidential activities. Legislative power: Federal Assembly; competences of the chambers - the Federation Council and the State Duma; electability of legislative bodies; governing bodies of the houses of parliament; functions of parliament. Executive power: federal government - its composition and principles of appointment; federal ministries; working mode of the federal government. The mass media system in Russia: all-Russian press, business press, advertising press, television, specificity of television broadcasting in Russia, Russian television networks, media empires in Russia, news agencies and their activities, the "big four" of the world's press agencies: UPI (United Press International), AP (Associated Press), AFP (Agence France Press), Reuters, an outline of the history of news agencies in Russia, ITAR-TASS, Interfaks, RIA "Novosti". Mass culture in Russia (selected issues). Stereotype of Russian and Russia in Poland. Creating the image of Russia in the Polish media (selected problems). The detailed topics of the classes are presented to students during the first classes.
